

SECS Network Drive

Your SECS Network Drive is mounted as your H: drive on any SECS domain computer (including [computer labs](#)). It is also your home directory when you connect to a SECS Linux Server. You can connect to your SECS Network Drive from a non-domain computer using the instructions below.

Network drives have a 30 Gigabyte storage limit. Subject to change according to demand.

H drives are permitted for student and faculty web hosting, Linux home directories, classwork, business and school related storage.

H drives are NOT an approved medium for the storage of PII, FERPA, HIPPA, or otherwise confidential information.

Network Drives are backed up weekly and will be held until 1 months after your SECS account is disabled. There is no warranty or extended support for personally owned data stored on H drives. There is no disaster recovery guarantee or off site backup.

How To Connect to the SECS Network Drive

 **Note:** Accessing the SECS Network Drive from off campus or over GrizzNet requires the user to connect to the [SECS VPN](#) first.

Windows

1. Open [File Explorer](#)
2. Type \\files.secs.oakland.edu\ in the address bar.
3. Login with your SECS username and password.

Linux

1. Open [Nautilus](#)
2. Select File then connect to Server
3. Choose the Following options

Service Type: "Windows Share"
Server: files.secs.oakland.edu
Share: YourUserName
Folder: <BLANK>
User Name: YourUSerName
Domain Name: SECS

4. Click Connect
5. Enter your password when prompted.

Mac OSX

1. Open [Finder](#)
2. Select "Go" from the Menu Bar
3. Choose "Connect to Server"
4. In the Server Address bar type smb://files.secs.oakland.edu
5. Select "Registered User"
6. Login with your SECS username and password
7. Select "Connect"

Alternative Methods to Connect to Your SECS Network Drive

 **Note:** Accessing the SECS Network Drive from off campus requires the user to connect to the [SECS VPN](#) first.

Use the [VPN web portal](#) and click the Network Drive link after you log in.

Use a SCP client such as winSCP to connect to login.secs.oakland.edu.
